Sir/Madam,

This is in reference to your application submitted to SEIAA vide proposal number SIA/UK/MIN/456692/2023 dated 30/12/2023 for grant of prior Environmental Clearance (EC) to the project under the provision of the EIA Notification 2006-and as amended thereof.

2. The particulars of the proposal are as below :

3. In view of the particulars given in the Para 1 above, the project proposal interalia including Form-2(Part A, B and C)/ EIA & EMP Reports were submitted to the SEIAA for an appraisal by the SEIAA under the provision of EIA notification 2006 and its subsequent amendments.

4. The above-mentioned proposal has been considered by SEIAA in the meeting held on 16/12/2024. The minutes of the meeting and all the project documents are available on PARIVESH portal which can be accessed from the PARIVESH portal by scanning the QR Code above. Brief description of the project is as under: The mining activities as proposed are the backbone of all construction and infrastructure projects.
5. Details of the minerals to be mined along with production capacity and the brief on the salient features of the project as submitted by the project proponent in Form 1 (Part A and B) in the reports and as presented during SEIAA are annexed to this EC as Annexure (1).
6. The SEIAA, in its meeting held on 16/12/2024, based on information submitted viz: Form 1 (Part A, B and C), EIA/EMP report etc & clarifications provided by the project proponent and after detailed deliberations on all technical aspects and public hearing issues and compliance thereto furnished by the Project Proponent, recommended the proposal for grant of Environment Clearance under the provision of EIA Notification, 2006 and as amended thereof subject to stipulation of Specific and Standard EC conditions as detailed in the point below.
7. The SEIAA has examined the proposal in accordance with the provisions contained in the Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) Notification, 2006 & further amendments thereto and based on the recommendations of the SEIAA hereby accords Environment Clearance for the instant proposal to M/s. JK Sharma Sharma under the provisions of EIA Notification, 2006 and as amended thereof subject to compliance of the Specific and Standard EC conditions as given in Annexure (2)
8. The Ministry reserves the right to stipulate additional conditions, if found necessary.
9. The Environmental Clearance to the aforementioned project is under provisions of EIA Notification, 2006. It does not tantamount to approvals/consent/permissions etc. required to be obtained under any other Act/Rule/regulation. The Project Proponent is under obligation to obtain approvals /clearances under any other Acts/ Regulations or Statutes, as applicable, to the project.
10. The PP is under obligation to implement commitments made in the Environment Management Plan, which forms part of this EC.
11. Validity of EC is upto 30/12/2023 from which the prior environmental clearance is granted by the regulatory authority.
12. General Instructions:
 1. The project proponent shall prominently advertise it at least in two local newspapers of the District or State, of which one shall be in the vernacular language within seven days indicating that the project has been accorded environment clearance and the details of SEIAA website where it is displayed.
 2. The copies of the environmental clearance shall be submitted by the project proponents to the Heads of local bodies, Panchayats and Municipal Bodies in addition to the relevant offices of the Government who in turn must display the same for 30 days from the date of receipt.
 3. The project proponent shall have a well laid down environmental policy duly approved by the Board of Directors (in case of Company) or competent authority, duly prescribing standard operating procedures to have proper checks and balances and to bring into focus any infringements/deviation/violation of the environmental / forest / wildlife norms / conditions.
 4. Action plan for implementing EMP and environmental conditions along with responsibility matrix of the project proponent (during construction phase) and authorized entity mandated with compliance of conditions (during operational phase) shall be prepared. The year wise funds earmarked for environmental protection measures shall be kept in separate account and not to be diverted for any other purpose. Six monthly progress of implementation of action plan shall be reported to the Ministry/Regional Office along with the Six-Monthly Compliance Report.
 5. Concealing factual data or submission of false/fabricated data may result in revocation of this environmental clearance and attract action under the provisions of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.
 6. The Regional Office of this SEIAA shall monitor compliance of the stipulated conditions. The project

authorities should extend full cooperation to the officer (s) of the Regional Office by furnishing the requisite data / information/monitoring reports.

7. Any appeal against this EC shall lie with the National Green Tribunal, if preferred, within a period of 30 days as prescribed under Section 16 of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010.

Standard EC Conditions for (Mining of minerals)

1. Land Recalvation

S. No	EC Conditions
1.1	Digital Survey of entire lease hold area/core zone using Satellite Remote Sensing survey shall be carried out at least once in three years for monitoring land use pattern and report in 1:50,000 scale or as notified by Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change(MOEFCC) from time to time shall be submitted to MOEFCC/Regional Office (RO).

Additional EC Conditions

1- Conditions to be complied before commencing mining operations:-

- 1) Environment Clearance is granted to final outcome of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, Hon'ble High Court of Uttarakhand and any other court of law, if any, as may be applicable to this project.
- 2) Project Proponent shall implement the Disaster Management Plan as the mine area is located in Seismic Zone IV. Project Proponent should submit the disaster plan within three months and form a committee to have check over any disaster to warn workers well before for the safety of workers. Emergency helpline number will be displayed at all levels.
- 3) The project proponent should advertise with basic details at least in two widely circulated local newspapers, within seven (7) days of the receipt of the clearance letter informing that the project has been accorded environmental clearance by the State Environment Impact Assessment Authority, Dehradun and a copy of the same be sent to the Regional Office of Ministry of Environment and Forest, Government of India located at 25 Subhash, Road Dehradun.
- 4) The project area should be demarcated with concrete pillars to show the natural bed level and the depth of mining allows Boundary Pillars at the interval of 50 m each on all four sides of the quarry site with red flag on each pillar and also on site pillars making the level and depth upto 1.5 mts downwards should be erected before Commencement of mining. A bench mark will be established to monitor the depth of mining.
- 5) A display board shall be erected in Hindi at each of the following place.
 - At project site
 - In nearest village
 - At the entrance of the village road from the main Road (ie)SH/NH etc. The information should be given in bold and visible letters.
- 6) A copy of the Environmental Clearance letter shall be sent by the proponent to the concerned Panchyat and the local NGO, if any from whom suggestion/representation, if any, were received while processing the proposal.
- 7) **From 2^{II} Year onwards replenishment study shall be done reputed institute, before start of the work and the report will be submitted to State Environment Impact Assessment Authority, Dehradun (SEIAA) and Regional Office of Ministry of Environment and Forest, Government of India located at 25 Subhash Road, Dehradun.**
- 8) Consent to Establish shall be obtained from Uttarakhand Pollution Control Board under relevant provisions of Central Air Act and Central Water Act before starting up of any mining activity at the site.
- 9) **Project Proponent shall undertake additional green belt development in the surrounding area with consultation of concerned forest office under the tree plantation campaign "EkPed Ma KeNaam" launched by Hon'ble Prime**

Minister of India.

2) Conditions for operation phase

7) The minor mineral collection shall be carried out manually from 50 % of the total area leaving 25 % area on each side of the riverbank. The Quantity of mineral shall not exceed as permitted in the approved DSR/Mining Plan (Whichever is less) as recommended by SEAC. However, district mining officer is directed to ensure that the quantity of material extracted should be in commensurate with the area allowed for mining.

12) Project Proponent shall submit numbers of vehicles used per day for transportation of mined minerals to and fro.

3) Conditions for entire life of the project

1) Legal status of the mining lease area shall remain unchanged and the Environmental Clearance shall remain coterminous with the lease period. The mined lease area shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the proposal.

2) In case of flash flood and river changing its meandering course, fresh proposal has to be submitted for grant of Environmental Clearance.

3) The project proponent shall formulate a transparent and unbiased procedure for engagement of labourers for sustainable extraction of the minor minerals from the mining lease area.

4) The project proponent shall use dust suppression equipment for sprinkling near by the mine site, so the PP was directed to leave 25 % area from the river bank sides.

5) The project proponent has to regulate and maintain record of the quantity of minor minerals extracted during a season. The monitoring shall be ensured by Department of mines/District Administration from time to time.

6) The project proponent shall strictly adhere to the norms of Transport Department in refraining from use of polluting and less fuel efficient vehicles for transporting extracted minor minerals. There shall be no over loading of vehicles as per standard norms of Central Government/State Government/Hon'ble Courts from time to time.

7) If the ownership is transferred then fresh Environment Clearance will be obtained under EIA notification dated 14.09.2006. However, no activity shall be undertaken till the Environment Clearance is transferred in his name and he is lawfully bound to comply with the conditions of the Environmental Clearance.

8) The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate has formulated the "Sustainable Sand Mining Management Guidelines 2016". The Proponent shall ensure the implementation of the Sustainable Sand Mining Management Guidelines 2016.

9) The project proponent shall set up Environment Management Cell which will also coordinate with general public, regulatory authorities and local administration to appraise environmental performance of the mining activity.

10) If it is found that if conditions laid down by the Authority are violated, the Authority may suspend or cancel this Environmental Clearance.

11) This Environmental Clearance (E.C.) is subject to obtaining clearance under the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 from the competent Authority as may be applicable to this project.

12) The EC issued will be coterminous with the Forest Clearance issued by MoEF&CC, GOI.

13) The ministry or any other competent authority may alter/modify the above conditions or stipulate any further condition in the interest of Environment Protection.

14) Concealing factual data or submission of false/fabricated information/data and failure to comply with of any conditions mentioned above may result in withdrawal of this clearance and attract action under the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.

15) The Project Proponent shall follow all relevant directions/orders issued by Hon'ble High Court/NGT/ Supreme Court.

16) Any appeal against this Environment Clearance shall lie with the National Green Tribunal, if preferred, within a period of 30 days as prescribed under section of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010.

4) Specific Conditions:- (To be followed by Director Industry, Geology and Mining Unit, Govt. of Uttarakhand).

1) A study shall be carried out in the second year through a reputed institute relating to replenishment of the mineral so as to ensure that the quantity of mineral to be removed does not exceed the siltation to avoid over exploitation of mineral, which may adversely affect the dynamics of river. A copy of said study report shall be submitted to the regional office of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Dehradun and SEIAA, Uttarakhand before the start of work.

2) The Geology and Mining unit of Industry Department shall ensure site specific river training works at the work site to ensure bank protection. Mining department should ensure that a Corpus fund for this purpose will be set up and kept at the disposal of District Magistrate.

3) The Geology and Mining unit of Industry Department shall identify an agency for regular/periodical monitoring of quality of ground water of existing hand pumps and tube wells in the vicinity of the mining site.

4) Digital processing of the entire lease area using remote sensing technique should be done by Geology and Mining

department regularly once in three years for monitoring the change of river course, if any and report should be submitted to the Ministry of Environment and Forests, Regional office at Dehradun and SEIAA, Uttarakhand.

5) Enforcement & Monitoring Guidelines for Sand Mining 2020 (<http://environmentclearance.nic.in/writereaddata/SandMiningManagementGuidelines2020.pdf>) issued by MoEF&CC shall be followed

The SEAC during its meeting held on 26th February, 2024 had undertaken appraisal of the above project. It has been found that the proposal is classified under Category B1 of EIA Notification 2006. The proponent has submitted PFR, EMP and other relevant documents as desired. After due examination of the relevant documents/certificates submitted by the project proponent and additional clarification furnished in response to its observations earlier, SEAC has recommended the grant of Environmental Clearance for the above project, subject to compliance of the EMP and other stipulated conditions like **"The minor mineral collection shall be carried out manually from 50 % of the total area leaving 25 % area on each side of the river bank. The Quantity of mineral shall not exceed as permitted in the approved DSR/Mining Plan (Whichever is less)"**. SEIAA during its meeting dated 16th December 2024 considered the above proposal based on the recommendation of SEAC. After due examination and deliberation, the **SEIAA Uttarakhand hereby accords Environmental Clearance** for the above project under category B-1 of EIA notification 2006 (as amended from time to time) subject to the strict compliance with the General, Specific and other conditions mentioned below:-

- 1) Environment Clearance is granted to final outcome of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, Hon'ble High Court of Uttarakhand and any other court of law, if any, as may be applicable to this project.

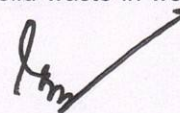

- 8) Consent to Establish shall be obtained from Uttarakhand Pollution Control Board under relevant provisions of Central Air Act and Central Water Act before starting up of any mining activity at the site.
- 9) **Project Proponent shall undertake additional green belt development in the surrounding area with consultation of concerned forest office under the tree plantation campaign "EkPed Ma KeNaam" launched by Hon'ble Prime Minister of India.**

2) Conditions for operation phase

- 1) The project proponent shall obtain clearance from National Board of Wildlife (NBWL).
- 2) The mining/extraction/hand picking of minor mineral shall be carried out as per the approved mine plan.
- 3) The total mine lease area of the project 628.8 Ha which is a forest land falling under Dehradun Forest Division, in Dehradun District.
- 4) The project proponent has obtained Forest Clearance from MoEF&CC (Forest Conservation Division) vide letter no- 8-62/1999FC(VOL) dated 20.10.2021 as per Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for an area of 202.0 Ha.
- 5) Out of the total allotted area of 628.8 Ha, the minor mineral collection shall be carried out manually from 202.0 Ha. leaving 25 % area on each side of the river bank. The area available for mining would therefore be 101 Ha. along the center of the river flow.
- 6) The mining shall be done only during day time.
- 7) **The minor mineral collection shall be carried out manually from 50 % of the total area leaving 25 % area on each side of the riverbank. The Quantity of mineral shall not exceed as permitted in the approved DSR/Mining Plan (Whichever is less) as recommended by SEAC. However, district mining officer is directed to ensure that the quantity of material extracted should be in commensurate with the area allowed for mining.**
- 8) **The mining operation will not be carried out in safety zone of any bridge.**
- 9) The Project Proponent shall follow Sustainable Sand Mining Management Guideline, 2016 & Enforcement and Monitoring Guideline for Sand Mining, 2020.
- 10) The mine working will be open cast by manual method without involving drilling & blasting. The mining is confined to extraction of Sand/Bajri/Boulder(River Bed Material). The Sand and Bajri will be collected by sieving of river material using hand tools like shovel, pan, sieve etc. **No JCB or such machines shall be used for mining.**
- 11) The quantity of mineral to be extracted should be fixed sustainably based on replenishment study. **The report shall be submitted to SEIAA as soon as possible.**
- 12) **Project Proponent shall submit numbers of vehicles used per day for transportation of mined minerals to and fro.**
- 13) The site should have well demarcated safety zone from nearby bridges, educational institution or structures of historical importance.
- 14) The mining operation would provide local employment and bring economic benefit to local population.
- 15) The Project Proponent shall obtain prior permission of the competent authorities for drawl of requisite quantity of water (surface water and ground water) if any, required for the project.

- 16) It shall be ensured that there is no leakage of oil and grease in the river from the vehicles use for the transportation.
- 17) Vehicular emission shall be kept under control and regularly monitored. The vehicles carrying minerals shall not be over loaded.
- 18) Periodical medical examination of the workers engaged in the project shall be carried out and records are to be maintained.
- 19) Water spraying arrangement on haul roads, loading and unloading and at transfer points should be provided and properly maintained.
- 20) Personnel working in dusty areas should wear protective respiratory devices and they should also be provided with adequate training and information on safety and health aspects.
- 21) Regular health checkup of workers by recognized medical practitioners shall be ensured by the Project proponent and shall submit report to SEIAA along with six monthly compliance report.
- 22) The project proponent will submit reports pertaining to ambient air quality, report pertaining to ground water quality and noise. These reports should be monitored and generated by a NABL approved laboratory having scope of it.
- 23) The mining/extraction of mineral and progressive mine closure should be done as per the approved mine plan. The mine plan should have validity till the mining period
- 24) The project area shall be strictly used for the activities permitted. The workers will be strictly instructed to not to enter in the adjoining forest and not to harm any wildlife and existing vegetation for their various needs. No work shall be carried out after sunset
- 25) The overall manpower will be restricted to bare minimum. Though mostly local labour will be deployed, but for the essential manpower staying at site, fuel wood will be provide for their cooking purpose
- 26) Sufficient numbers of dustbins will be provided to labourers for collection of their daily use garbage, Bio-degradable & solid garbage will be collected in separated bins & proper disposal of these garbage will be ascertained.
- 27) At no stage mining shall be carried out after exhausting extraction of the estimated mineable quantity as stated above.
- 28) The mining operation would provide local employment and bring economic benefits to local population.
- 29) The Proponent should provide Eco-friendly toilets for the workforce. The workers shall be directed to use the sanitation facilities provided at project site and instructed not to litter the project site. Sufficient numbers of Bio-Toilets will be provide to workers at safe distance from river flow bed.
- 30) Wild Animals being sensitive to noise, no project activities shall be carried out at night (sunset to sunrise) time.
- 31) All workers shall be imparted basic knowledge regarding the Do's and Don'ts of working within Forest Areas.
- 32) Photography of the proposed mining site (preferably using Drone) should be done and submitted to SEIAA along with half-yearly compliance report.
- 33) Extraction of minor minerals shall be restricted to middle half of the width of river bed/mining site after leaving intact one-fourth of width of the river bed/mining site along its each bank. Breaking of boulders shall not be permitted in the mining lease area.
- 34) The collection of minor minerals during a working season shall start from centre of the river/mining site width and shall gradually extend to the boundary of the permissible area so as to ensure maintenance of river geometry. The maximum permissible depth for collection of minor minerals at centre of the river/mining site width shall be fixed at 3.0 meter or up to ground water level whichever is less.
- 35) Extraction of minor mineral is permitted from 1st October of every year to 30th June of the subsequent year. It shall be ensured that no mining activity is carried out during the monsoon season. Workers should be advised and protected against flash flood during 15th June to 30th June and 1st Oct to 31st Oct during which there may be rains in the hills.
- 36) The project proponent has to regulate and maintain record of the quantity of minor minerals extracted during a season. The monitoring shall be ensured by Mines Department/District Administration from time to time as per rules.
- 37) The project proponent shall strictly adhere to the norms of Transport Department in refraining from use of polluting and less fuel efficient vehicles for transporting extracted minor minerals. There shall be no over loading of vehicles as per standard norms of Central Government/State Government/Hon'ble Courts from time to time.
- 38) The project proponent shall ensure that maximum local labour be engaged and hence employment opportunity provided. The project proponent shall follow all safety measures for labour force engaged in accordance with respected Acts/Rules.
- 39) The project proponent shall undertake adequate safeguard measures during extraction of river bed material and ensure that due to this activity the hydro-geological regime of the surrounding area are not affected. The proponent should not interfere with the flow of water and amount of water.
- 40) The project proponent shall ensure refraining from leaving behind clothes, personal belongings of labour engaged, polythene, plastic bottles, carton etc or any other solid waste in work site at the end of working season.



- 41) The project proponent shall provide protective respiratory devices to workers working in dusty areas and they shall also be provided with adequate training and information on safety and health aspects. Periodical medical examination of the workers engaged in the project shall be carried out and records maintained.
 - 42) Link Road from mining site to main Road shall be maintained by the project-proponent. The width of link road from mine site/gate to the main road should not be less than 6 meters.
 - 43) Project Proponent shall implant the disaster management plan as the mine area is located in seismic zone-IV emergency helpline number will be displayed at all levels.
 - 44) The numbers and position of gates for transporting mineral from river bed will not be changed without approval of SEIAA.
 - 45) The topsoil if any shall be stacked at earmarked site only and shall be used for reclamation.
 - 46) Mineral handling, loading and unloading areas including all the transfer points should have efficient dust control arrangements. These should be properly maintained & operated.
 - 47) Effective safeguard measures, such as regular water sprinkling shall be carried out in critical areas prone to air pollution and having high levels of particulate matter such as loading and unloading point and all transfer points. Extensive water sprinkling shall be carried out on haul roads. It should be ensured that the Ambient Air Quality parameters conform to the norms prescribed by the Central Pollution Control Board in this regard.
 - 48) Project proponent will strictly comply with provisions of EMP
 - 49) Project proponent will have to submit EMP/EIA report to Mining Department (Lessee) and Pollution Control Board before getting work order/Consent to Establish or Operate.
 - 50) **Regular water sprinkling shall be done on the Haul Road.**
 - 51) Failure to comply with of any conditions mentioned above may result in withdrawal of this clearance and attract action under the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.
 - 52) The project proponent shall submit half yearly compliance report of stipulated conditions of Environment Clearance in soft copy through PARIVESH PORTAL given link: <https://parivesh.nic.in>. The compliance report shall also be e mailed to the Regional Office in Dehradun in moef.ddn@gov.in
- 3) **Conditions for entire life of the project**
- 1) Legal status of the mining lease area shall remain unchanged and the Environmental Clearance shall remain coterminous with the lease period. The mined lease area shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the proposal.
 - 2) In case of flash flood and river changing its meandering course, fresh proposal has to be submitted for grant of Environmental Clearance.
 - 3) The project proponent shall formulate a transparent and unbiased procedure for engagement of labourers for sustainable extraction of the minor minerals from the mining lease area.
 - 4) The project proponent shall use dust suppression equipment for sprinkling near by the mine site, so the PP was directed to leave 25 % area from the river bank sides.
 - 5) The project proponent has to regulate and maintain record of the quantity of minor minerals extracted during a season. The monitoring shall be ensured by Department of mines/District Administration from time to time.
 - 6) The project proponent shall strictly adhere to the norms of Transport Department in refraining from use of polluting and less fuel efficient vehicles for transporting extracted minor minerals. There shall be no over loading of vehicles as per standard norms of Central Government/State Government/Hon'ble Courts from time to time.
 - 7) If the ownership is transferred then fresh Environment Clearance will be obtained under EIA notification dated 14.09.2006. However, no activity shall be undertaken till the Environment Clearance is transferred in his name and he is lawfully bound to comply with the conditions of the Environmental Clearance.
 - 8) The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate has formulated the "Sustainable Sand Mining Management Guidelines 2016". The Proponent shall ensure the implementation of the Sustainable Sand Mining Management Guidelines 2016.
 - 9) The project proponent shall set up Environment Management Cell which will also coordinate with general public, regulatory authorities and local administration to appraise environmental performance of the mining activity.
 - 10) If it is found that if conditions laid down by the Authority are violated, the Authority may suspend or cancel this Environmental Clearance.
 - 11) This Environmental Clearance (E.C.) is subject to obtaining clearance under the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 from the competent Authority as may be applicable to this project.
 - 12) The EC issued will be coterminus with the Forest Clearance issued by MoEF&CC, GOI.
 - 13) The ministry or any other competent authority may alter/modify the above conditions or stipulate any further condition in the interest of Environment Protection.
 - 14) Concealing factual data or submission of false/fabricated information/data and failure to comply with of any conditions mentioned above may result in withdrawal of this clearance and attract action under the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.
 - 15) The Project Proponent shall follow all relevant directions/orders issued by Hon'ble High Court/NGT/ Supreme Court.

16) Any appeal against this Environment Clearance shall lie with the National Green Tribunal, if preferred, within a period of 30 days as prescribed under section of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010.

4) Specific Conditions:- (To be followed by Director Industry, Geology and Mining Unit, Govt. of Uttarakhand).

- 1) A study shall be carried out in the second year through a reputed institute relating to replenishment of the mineral so as to ensure that the quantity of mineral to be removed does not exceed the siltation to avoid over exploitation of mineral, which may adversely affect the dynamics of river. A copy of said study report shall be submitted to the regional office of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Dehradun and SEIAA, Uttarakhand before the start of work.
- 2) The Geology and Mining unit of Industry Department shall ensure site specific river training works at the work site to ensure bank protection. Mining department should ensure that a Corpus fund for this purpose will be set up and kept at the disposal of District Magistrate.
- 3) The Geology and Mining unit of Industry Department shall identify an agency for regular/periodical monitoring of quality of ground water of existing hand pumps and tube wells in the vicinity of the mining site.
- 4) Digital processing of the entire lease area using remote sensing technique should be done by Geology and Mining department regularly once in three years for monitoring the change of river course, if any and report should be submitted to the Ministry of Environment and Forests, Regional office at Dehradun and SEIAA, Uttarakhand.
- 5) Enforcement & Monitoring Guidelines for Sand Mining 2020 (<http://environmentclearance.nic.in/writereaddata/SandMiningManagementGuidelines2020.pdf>) issued by MoEF&CC shall be followed
