This is in reference to your application for Grant of EC under the provision of the EIA Notification 2006-regarding in respect of project Rishi Kumar Yadav submitted to Ministry vide proposal number SIA/CG/MIN/454553/2023 dated 13/07/2024.

SEIAA in its 198th Meeting held on 22/07/2025 perused the case and minutes of the 598th meeting of SEAC-1 held on 27/03/2025. It is noted that original application is for mining of Earth Clay (Minor Minerals) capacity - 1,400 cum/year (No. of bricks Per Year – 10,00,000). After deliberation, SEIAA unanimously accepted the recommendation of SEAC-1 and decided to grant environmental clearance for mining of Earth Clay capacity – 1,400 cum/year (No. of bricks Per Year

– 10,00,000) (maximum production quantity as per mining plan) in Kharsa No. 12/3 & 36/1, area – 1.579 Ha. of Village - Bokhi, Tehsil - Farsabahal, District - Jashpur, Chhattisgarh.

3. This Environment Clearance is for Earth Clay capacity – 1,400 cum/year (No. of bricks Per Year – 10,00,000) (maximum production quantity as per mining plan) in Kharsa No. 12/3 & 36/1, area – 1.579 Ha. of Village - Bokhi, Tehsil - Farsabahal, District - Jashpur, Chhattisgarh.
4. In view of the particulars given in the Para 1 above, the project proposal interalia including Form-1 (Part A & B) were submitted to the SEIAA under the provision of EIA notification 2006 and its subsequent amendments.
5. The above-mentioned proposal has been considered by State Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA) in the meeting held on 22/07/2025. The minutes of the meeting and all the Application and documents submitted are available on PARIVESH portal which can be accessed by scanning the QR Code above.
6. Details of the minerals to be mined along with production capacity and the brief on the salient features of the project as submitted by the project proponent in Form 1 (Part A & B) presented are annexed to this EC as Annexure (1).
7. The SEAC, in its meeting held on 27/03/2025, based on information & clarifications provided by the project proponent and after detailed deliberations on all technical aspects and compliance thereto furnished by the Project Proponent, recommended the proposal for grant of Environment Clearance under the provision of EIA Notification, 2006 and as amended thereof subject to stipulation of Specific and Standard EC conditions as detailed in the point below.
8. The SEIAA has examined the proposal in accordance with the Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) Notification, 2006 & further amendments thereto and after accepting the recommendations of the SEAC and hereby decided to grant Environment Clearance for the instant proposal under the provisions of EIA Notification, 2006 and as amended thereof subject to compliance of the Specific and Standard EC conditions as given in Annexure (2).
9. The Ministry reserves the right to stipulate additional conditions, if found necessary.
10. The Environmental Clearance to the aforementioned project is under provisions of EIA Notification, 2006. It does not tantamount to approvals/consent/permissions etc. required to be obtained under any other Act/Rule/regulation. The Project Proponent is under obligation to obtain approvals /clearances under any other Acts/ Regulations or Statutes, as applicable, to the project.
11. The PP is under obligation to implement commitments made in the Environment Management Plan, which forms part of this EC.
12. General Instructions:
 1. The project proponent shall prominently advertise it at least in two local newspapers of the District or State, of which one shall be in the vernacular language within seven days indicating that the project has been accorded environment clearance and the details of SEIAA website where it is displayed.
 2. The copies of the environmental clearance shall be submitted by the project proponents to the Heads of local bodies, Panchayats and Municipal Bodies in addition to the relevant offices of the Government who in turn must display the same for 30 days from the date of receipt.
 3. The project proponent shall have a well laid down environmental policy duly approved by the Board of Directors (in case of Company) or competent authority, duly prescribing standard operating procedures to have proper checks and balances and to bring into focus any infringements/deviation/violation of the environmental / forest / wildlife norms / conditions.
 4. Action plan for implementing EMP and environmental conditions along with responsibility matrix of the project proponent (during construction phase) and authorized entity mandated with compliance of conditions (during operational phase) shall be prepared. The year wise funds earmarked for environmental protection measures shall be kept in separate account and not to be diverted for any other purpose. Six monthly progress of implementation of action plan shall be reported to the Ministry/Regional Office along with the Six-Monthly Compliance Report.
 5. Concealing factual data or submission of false/fabricated data may result in revocation of this environmental clearance and attract action under the provisions of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.

6. The Regional Office of this SEIAA shall monitor compliance of the stipulated conditions. The project authorities should extend full cooperation to the officer (s) of the Regional Office by furnishing the requisite data / information/monitoring reports.

7. Any appeal against this EC shall lie with the National Green Tribunal, if preferred, within a period of 30 days as prescribed under Section 16 of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010.

1. Specific Condition

PP shall submit the compliance report for plantation over entire safety zone area along with geotag photography and drone survey photography within one year of grant of EC date. 2. PP shall install the zig- zag technology for firing bricks in the kiln established in lease area and submit details with photograph with six monthly compliance report. 3. Chhattisgarh Environment Conservation Board shall ensure that without installation of zig-zag kiln technology air and water consent shall not be issued under any circumstances. Consent shall be granted only after the installation of zig-zag kiln technology brick kilns. 4. Project Proponent shall follow the terms and conditions mentioned in MoEF&CC notification G.S.R. (E) dated 22.02.2022. 5. Project proponent shall submit the details of the sourcing of fly ash used in brick manufacturing by way of purchase receipt, way bill etc. from Power Plant / Sponge Iron Plant / Other units generating fly ash.

1.1	<p>Additional Conditions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Project proponent shall ensure the erection of boundary pillars as per provisions of Minor minerals Rules 2015, and shall also do fencing all along the mining boundary.2. The Project proponent shall do plantation over entire safety zone for developing green belt with healthy species which has fast growth and has good canopy cover to serve as barrier for propagation of pollutants from mine area.3. The Project proponent shall ensure minimum 90% survival rate of plantation after 5 years.4. The six-monthly report regarding compliance of plantation over 1 meter safety zone area should be submitted along with geotag photographs and drone survey photography.5. The mining should be carried out in accordance to approved mine plan and as per provisions of applicable Minor minerals Rules 2015.6. If the mineral transport route passes through or nearby to residential area, then the road should be wetted to minimize the dust emission, and arrangement for water sprinkling at required interval should be made.8. The PP shall ensure that the mine's contaminated water should not go directly to nearby water body, make garland drain and silting ponds at required places for arresting the silt before mine water go to nearby nallah. The desilting of silting ponds should be done regularly.10. The PP shall submit the permission from competent authority for use of water and should install the measuring instrument for consumption of water and maintain logbook for it.11. The PP shall make arrangement for energy conservation and promote the use of non-conventional energy like solar lights.12. The CER Plan should be implemented within one year and it should be operated and maintained till the mine closure plan is implemented.13. Employment to the local people should be provided under the Chhattisgarh Model Rehabilitation Policy.14. Project proponent shall not cut any Green Trees of lease area without the permission of District Collector.15. Regular monitoring of ground water level and quality shall be carried out in and around the mine lease area by establishing a network of existing wells and constructing new piezometers during the mining operations. 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

The project proponent shall submit the environmental statement for each financial year in Form-V to the concerned State Pollution Control Board as prescribed under the Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986, as amended subsequently and put on the website of the company. 6. The project authorities shall inform to the Regional Office of the MOEFCC regarding commencement of mining operations. 7. The project authorities must strictly adhere to the stipulations made by the State Pollution Control Board and the State Government. 8. No further expansion or modifications in the plant shall be carried out without prior approval of the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change (MoEF&CC). 9. Concealing factual data or submission of false/fabricated data may result in revocation of this environmental clearance and attract action under the provisions of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986. 10. The Ministry may revoke or suspend the clearance, if implementation of any of the above conditions is not satisfactory. 11. The Ministry reserves the right to stipulate additional conditions if found necessary. The Company in a time bound manner shall implement these conditions. 12. The Regional Office of this Ministry shall monitor compliance of the stipulated conditions. The project authorities should extend full cooperation to the officer (s) of the Regional Office by furnishing the requisite data / information/ monitoring reports. 13.
