SEIAA in its 209th Meeting held on 23/10/2025 perused the case and minutes of the 679th Meeting of SEAC1 held on 19/08/2025.

It is noted that original application is for mining of Ordinary Stone (Minor Minerals) capacity- 22,536.54 TPA. After deliberation, SEIAA unanimously accepted the recommendation of SEAC-1 and decided to grant Environmental

Clearance for mining of Ordinary Stone (Minor Minerals) capacity – 22,536.54 TPA in khasra no. 713/1, Area – 1.019 Hectare at Village - Narkalo, Tehsil - Lakhanpur, District – Surguja, Chhattisgarh under the EIA Notification, 2006 (as amended) listed in Schedule 1(a) Mining of minerals under Category “B2”.

3. This Environment Clearance is for mining of Ordinary Stone (Minor Minerals) capacity – 22,536.54 TPA in khasra no. 713/1, Area – 1.019 Hectare at Village - Narkalo, Tehsil - Lakhanpur, District – Surguja, Chhattisgarh.
4. In view of the particulars given in the Para 1 above, the project proposal interalia including Form-1 (Part A and B) were submitted to the SEIAA under the provision of EIA notification 2006 and its subsequent amendments.
5. The above-mentioned proposal has been considered by State Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA) in the meeting held on 23/10/2025. The minutes of the meeting and all the Application and documents submitted are available on PARIVESH portal which can be accessed by scanning the QR Code above.
6. Details of the minerals to be mined along with production capacity and the brief on the salient features of the project as submitted by the project proponent in Form 1 (Part A and B) presented are annexed to this EC as Annexure (1).
7. The SEAC, in its meeting held on 19/08/2025, based on information & clarifications provided by the project proponent and after detailed deliberations on all technical aspects and compliance thereto furnished by the Project Proponent, recommended the proposal for grant of Environment Clearance under the provision of EIA Notification, 2006 and as amended thereof subject to stipulation of Specific and Standard EC conditions as detailed in the point below.
8. The SEIAA has examined the proposal in accordance with the Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) Notification, 2006 & further amendments thereto and after accepting the recommendations of the SEAC and hereby decided to grant Environment Clearance for the instant proposal under the provisions of EIA Notification, 2006 and as amended thereof subject to compliance of the Specific and Standard EC conditions as given in Annexure (2).
9. The Ministry reserves the right to stipulate additional conditions, if found necessary.
10. The Environmental Clearance to the aforementioned project is under provisions of EIA Notification, 2006. It does not tantamount to approvals/consent/permissions etc. required to be obtained under any other Act/Rule/regulation. The Project Proponent is under obligation to obtain approvals /clearances under any other Acts/ Regulations or Statutes, as applicable, to the project.

1. Special Conditions

1.1	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The PP shall complete the restoration of the excavated 7.5 meter wide safety area of the mine as per the revised mining plan.2. Project Proponent shall do plantation in the restored area as per the condition of the previous EC.3. Compliance of the completion of the above conditions is mandatory. If these conditions are not complied within 3 months, the concerned RO, CECB shall take necessary steps to stop the mining operations and resumption of the mining operations will be subject to the fulfilling of above conditions.

1. Statutory Compliance

1.1	<p>Additional Conditions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The PP shall complete the restoration of the excavated 7.5 meter wide safety area of the mine as per the revised mining plan.2. The project proponent shall complete the restoration of excavated portion of safety zone area as per submitted restoration plan within 3 months of grant of EC.3. Compliance of the completion of the above conditions is mandatory. If these conditions are not complied within 3 months, the concerned RO, CECB shall take necessary steps to stop the mining operations and resumption of the mining operations will be subject to the fulfilling of above conditions.4. Project proponent shall ensure the erection of boundary pillars as per provisions of Minor minerals Rules 2015, and shall also do fencing all along the mining boundary.5. The Project proponent shall do plantation over entire safety zone for developing green belt with healthy species which has fast growth and has good canopy cover to serve as barrier for propagation of pollutants from mine area.6. The Project proponent shall ensure minimum 90% survival rate of plantation after 5 years.7. The six-monthly report regarding compliance of plantation over entire safety zone area should be submitted along with geotag photographs and drone survey photography.8. The top soil and overburden generated should be kept within mining lease area (but not over safety zone area) and shall be used only for plantation / spreading over backfilled area. If the over burden / top soil is stored over safety zone area, then garland drain all around the stacked over burden should be made so as the over burden should not get spread out beyond mining lease area during rainy season.

In case the safety zone area has been already mined out then, The Project proponent shall submit the restoration plan for mined out portion of safety zone along with estimate (including plantation) and should complete within six months from grant of EC. Retaining wall of appropriate height should be made all around the overburden dump site.</p> <p>10. The mining should be carried out in accordance to approved mine plan and as per provisions of applicable Minor minerals Rules 2015.</p> <p>11. The PP shall take necessary permission from DGMS for carrying out blasting.</p> <p>12. The PP shall adopt the Control Blasting technique for keeping ground vibration within DGMS permissible limit, and should obtain necessary permission from DGMS.</p> <p>13. The Environmental clearance shall be subject to orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, Hon'ble High Courts, NGT and any other Court of Law, from time to time, and as applicable to the project. 2. Ambient air quality monitoring shall be conducted once in a year in the core zone as well as in the buffer zone for monitoring of pollutants, namely particulates, SO₂ and NO_x. Data on ambient air quality and heavy metals such as Hg, As, Ni, Cd, Cr and other monitoring data shall be regularly reported to the Ministry/Regional Office and to the CPCB/SPCB. 3. Transportation of minerals, to the extent if permitted by road, shall be carried out by covered trucks. Effective control measures such as regular water sprinkling etc., shall be carried out in critical areas prone to air pollution with higher level of particulate matter all through the transport roads, loading/unloading and transfer points. Fugitive dust emissions from all sources shall be controlled regularly. All the vehicles engaged in mining and allied activities shall operate only after obtaining 'PUC' certificate from the authorized pollution testing centers. 8. Water sprinkling arrangement shall be provided to reduce the impact of air pollution. 9. Post environmental closure third party monitoring by reputed instituted in air quality, water, land & soil etc shall be carried out and analyses with EMP measures at regular interval. A suitable recommendation in this regard, shall be furnished to IRO, MoEF&CC for compliance. <p>Water quality monitoring and mitigation measures:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Regular monitoring of ground water level and quality shall be carried out in and around the mine lease area by establishing a network of existing wells and constructing new piezometers during the mining operations. The ground water quality shall be monitored once a year, and the data thus collected shall be sent regularly to MOEFCC/RO. 2. The total amount of expenses in the five years will be Rs. 1,10,000/-. The consent of the Head Master of School has been submitted by the project proponent for the CER work to be done.
